The Grassroots Institute for Fundraising Training (GIFT) is a multiracial organization that promotes the connection between fundraising, social justice and movement-building. GIFT builds the capacity of nonprofit organizations to raise money and develop healthy, diverse, and sustainable fundraising programs. We believe that how groups are funded is as important to achieving their goals as how the money is spent, and that building community support is central to long-term social change.

GIFT trains 300+ organizations each year, and specializes in training organizations with budgets below \$1 million, especially those working for social justice and those based in communities of color. GIFT's training, capacity building, and consulting services seek to develop and strengthen the fundraising knowledge and skills of grassroots fundraisers, increase the capacity of organizations to integrate fundraising with programmatic work, and develop effective grassroots fundraising plans.

Community Organizer, Trans Queer Pueblo (Phoenix, AZ)



Dagoberto started organizing in 2006 to stop Proposition 300, that would bar undocumented students from accessing in-state tuition.

He has worked since 2011 to create safe space for people who identify as UndocuQueer and later became involved in anti-LGBTQ deportation work. Dago uses cultural organizing through drag performance to speak about intersections of LGBTQ+, migrant, and people of color identities.

Crystal (she/they) is the Executive Director of Chinook Fund, a community foundation supporting grassroots organizations working in social and economic justice throughout Colorado. In 2014, Crystal helped launch the "Resourcing & Sustaining Our Movements" track at the Allied Media Conference. She is a fellow with Transformative Leadership for Change and serves on the board of Resource Generation, which organizes young people with wealth and class privilege in the U.S. She spends

her spare time biking, eating ramen, building her vinyl collection, and camping throughout the West.

Jocelyn is an accomplished resource organizer with over 12 years of experience in nonprofit fundraising.
